- * A hardcover book has a cover that is hard like your desk. A paperback book has a cover that is soft like paper.

- * The things that happen in a story are called the plot.
- * A character is a person or animal who does things in a story.
- * A cliffhanger chapter ends when something bad is about to happen.
- * A sequel is a book that continues a story started in an earlier book.
- * A book plate is a sticker that you write your name in and put in a book to show it's yours (but only do this if it's your book and not the library's!).
- * Illustrations are the pictures the illustrator makes for the book.
- * The **conflict** is the problem the character solves.
